Look at the camera, not at the screen

It is very tempting to watch yourself or your interviewer, but looking directly at the camera is the only way to maintain direct eye contact.

- Prepare your surroundings
  Pick a quiet place to interview
  without an elaborate backdrop.
  Remove anything distracting behind
  you.
- When it comes to what you wear, treat your virtual interview like an inperson interview and dress professionally.
- Check You Computer Settings
  Before your interview, make sure
  you have the proper video and audio
  settings turned on. Do a test run
  before your interview.

## Contact

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Use notes, but don't rely only on notes

Don't be afraid to help yourself with post-it notes or a copy of your resume handy. Remember they are quick reminders, not a script.

Avoid interruptions

If you are interviewing in a house with multiple people or pets, be sure to let everyone know ahead of time you will be in an interview and to minimize WiFi usage.

Profile Settings

Make sure your first and last name are a part of your profile. That way, your interviewing can associate your face and name together.

Follow up

A thank-you letter is just as important after a virtual interview as it is in an in person interview.
